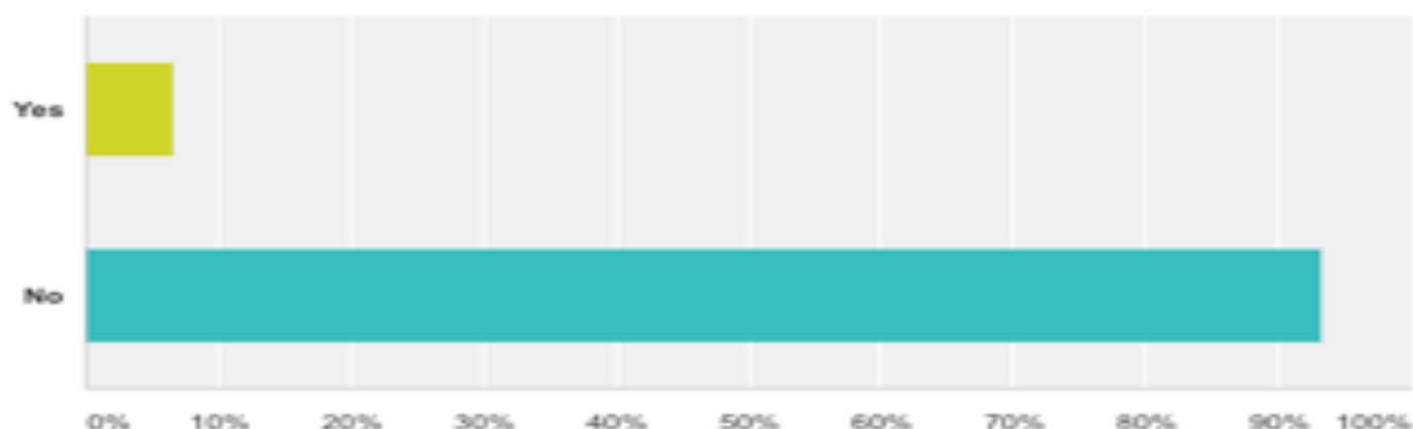

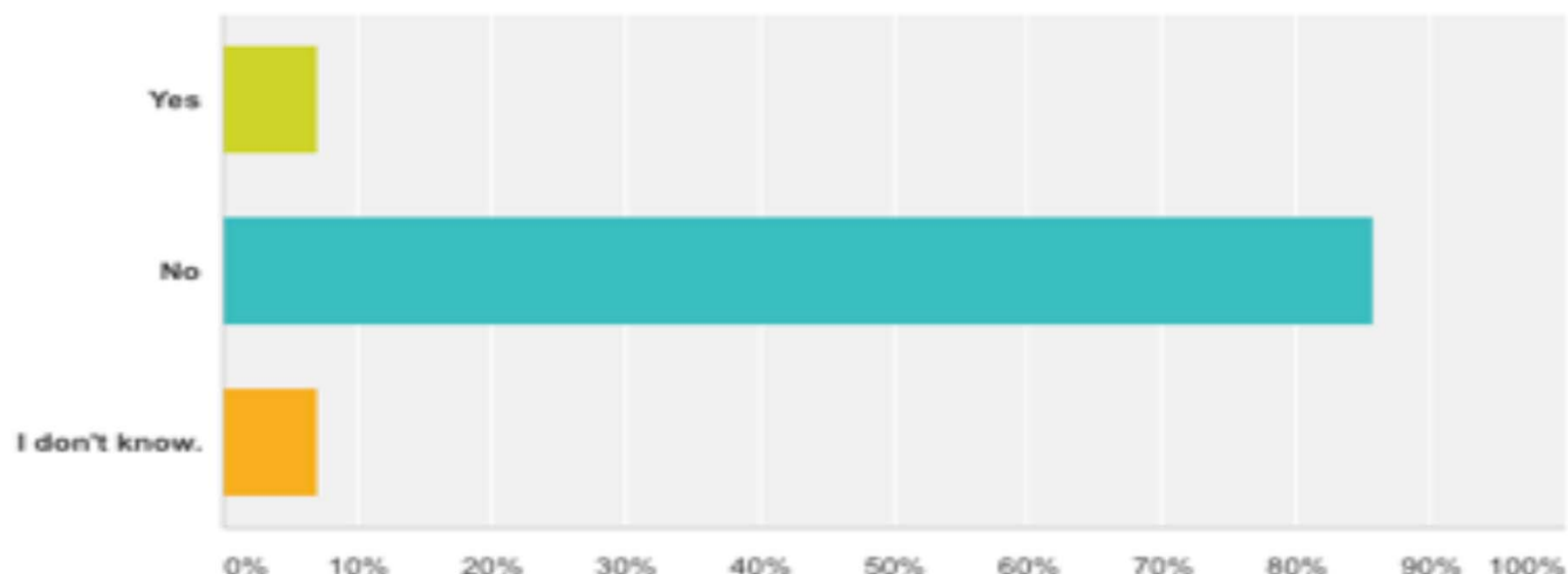

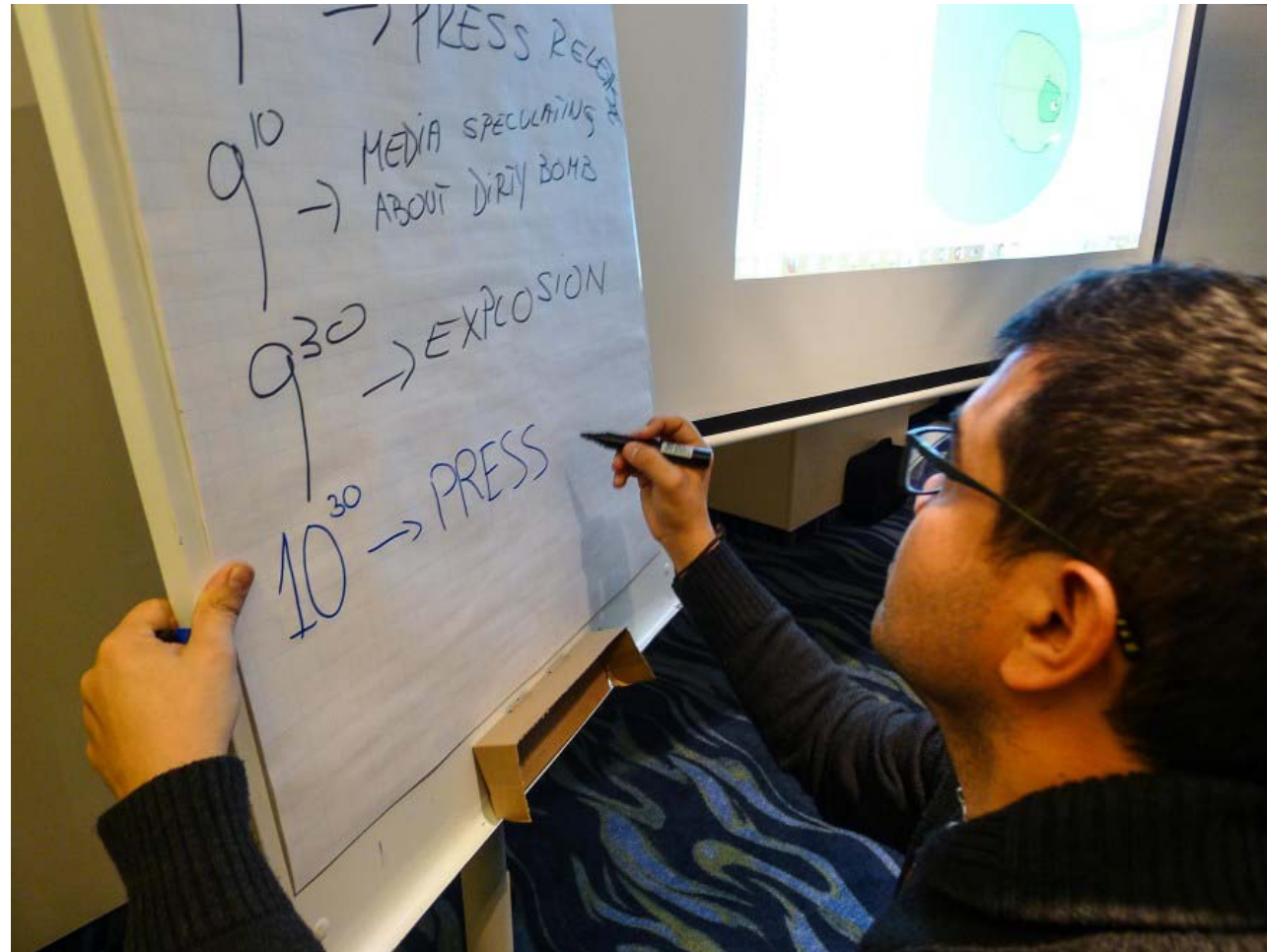












# Disappearing journalists
